The 1997 Crime in Alabama report is the twenty-second annual report published by the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC). This report concentrates on the major index offenses reported to the Uniform Crime Reporting program (UCR) by the state's law enforcement agencies for calendar year 1997.

The crime statistics presented in this report are compiled for the state, sheriffs' offices, municipal police departments and campus police. UCR data deals with criminal activity in a specific geographical area rather than with law enforcement agencies' activities; therefore, it should not be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another. UCR is only one aspect of the activities and responsibilities of the law enforcement community.

Preface

The 1997 Crime in Alabama report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama. Since the UCR offense and arrest data are the basis of this report, it must be noted that other factors affecting crime are not measured by UCR, such as age, sex, and race of the population, economic conditions of the area, transient population, culture, education, climate, attitudes of the victims toward crime and police, and crime reporting practices of the citizens. Therefore, it is difficult to draw conclusions or make valid comparisons between various jurisdictions by using only the crime and arrest data in this book. The data in this book are used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting. Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, county and city strata.

We would like to extend our appreciation to law enforcement agencies--sheriff's departments, municipal police departments, and campus police--for their cooperation in the UCR program.

Introduction

In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, Section 9, 1975)

With the passage of this bill, mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama. Prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) on a voluntary basis. Since mandatory submission, there has been a 185% increase in UCR reporting.

Alabama's UCR program functions in accordance with FBI standards of operation, i.e., a uniform data collection device and quality control procedures which provide viable crime statistics for accurate indication of crime and crime trends.

ACJIC implemented an incident-based reporting system as an alternative to UCR summary reporting in 1977. This Incident-Based Reporting (IBR) System also provides a self-contained internal record keeping system for the agency. IBR is a voluntary system with 99% of Alabama's agencies participating. This reporting program is more detailed providing greater potential for services, analyses, and resource studies by both the individual agency's crime analysis units and ACJIC.

In 1986, ACJIC organized a 32-person UCR Committee to review the IBR report forms. This committee was made up of law enforcement personnel from small, medium and large police departments and sheriff's departments, computerized agencies, the FBI, and the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS). The committee reviewed and analyzed the ten year old forms and decided that enhancements were needed. The IBR report forms were redesigned with input from Alabama's local agencies.

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly reporting forms by ACJIC's Technical Assistance field staff who are also made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications, and clearance data. The Technical Assistants are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system.

When the UCR incident reports are returned to ACJIC, they are reviewed for accuracy by the quality control section of UCR. Then the Alabama UCR program furnishes the contributing agencies and the FBI with monthly data for their verification and review process.

Alabama's law enforcement community can be proud of the progress made in the incident reporting program. Because of the support and dedication of our law enforcement Alabama is one of the states leading the way for a national IBR system.

Crime and Arrest Data

Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns. These analyses can then aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designating community education programs.

Data used in this report are provided by the Uniform Crime Reporting section (UCR) of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC). ACJIC's UCR section is the depository for reported offenses and has the responsibility of collecting and disseminating crime data. In 1997, approximately 300 agencies reported known offenses to Alabama's UCR; 99% of Alabama's law enforcement agencies submitted Incident Reports and 1% returned UCR Summaries.

Through a mandate of Congress, Arson is counted as a Part I Offense. So as not to distort crime trends in Total and Property Crime indices, Arson totals will not be included in these sections but will be included in a separate section following property crimes.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. These Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crime and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person(s) with a high risk or injury or death to the victim(s). Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson*. Property or Non-Violent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared, either by arrest or by exceptional means, when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him/her into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear several offenses or that several arrests could clear one offense. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported:

$$\text{CLEARANCES} = \frac{\text{CLEARANCE RATE}}{\text{REPORTED CRIME}}$$

This report is a composite picture of crime and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 1996. It provides a breakdown for the State and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the Index Crime of the FBI's Part I Offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percent changes.

*A separate section on arson will be included in this report.

Definition of Terms

- Adult** - the UCR system defines adults as 18 years of age and over.
- Arrest** - a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody.
- Arson** - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. (Through a Congressional mandate, 1979 was the first year arson was counted as a Part I offense.) Arson is divided into the following categories:

Structural

- Single occupancy residential - houses, townhouses, duplexes, etc.
Other residential - apartments, tenements, hotels, motels, dormitories, boarding houses, etc.
Storage - barns, garages, warehouses, etc.
Industrial/manufacturing.
Other commercial - stores, restaurants, offices, etc.
Community/public - churches, jails, schools, colleges, hospitals, etc.
All other structures - outbuildings, monuments, buildings under construction.

Mobile

- Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.
Other mobile property - trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes, boats, etc.
Other - crops, timber, fences, signs, etc.

- Assault** - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an assault.

- Burglary** - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

- Central city** - a city with at least 50,000 residents.

- City strata** - a breakdown of cities according to population.

- Clearance** - a measure of law enforcement activity which shows that a crime has been solved for crime reporting purposes either by the arrest of a suspect or by exceptional means. Exceptional means provides a solution to a crime

when there is enough evidence to place a formal charge against an offender, but some element beyond law enforcement control precludes an actual arrest. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense.

Clearance rate- the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

Crime rate - a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.

Criminal activity - measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.

Forcible entry - offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or felony.

Hierarchy of Offenses - whenever more than one offense is committed simultaneously, the most severe offense is reported to UCR. The exception is arson which is always reported along with the most serious offense.

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

Incident-Based Reporting System - a voluntary crime reporting system developed by ACJIC as an alternative to the UCR Summary.

Juveniles - the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females 17 years of age and younger.

Larceny - unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud, i.e., pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, theft from coin-operated machines, etc.

Law enforcement activity - police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.

Minimal injury - personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.

Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.

Motor vehicle theft - unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.

Non-residence - any structure used for purposes other than a residence.

Part I Index

Crimes - a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent.
The Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Part II Offenses - a category of UCR offenses which include:

Other assaults - non-aggravated assaults.

Forgery and counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.

Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.

Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

Stolen property - buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.

Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

Prostitution and commercialized vice - sex offenses of a commercial nature.

Sex offenses (other than rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.

Narcotic drug laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.

Gambling - promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

Offenses against the family and children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.

Driving under the influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or

common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

Liquor laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.

Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.

Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.

Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.

All other offenses - all violations of state or local laws, except categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations. Including, but not limited to bigamy, blackmail, bribery, contempt of court, discrimination, perjury, possession and/or sale of obscene material, quarantine violations, etc.

Property Crimes - (non-violent crimes) index crimes which lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s). Included in this category are burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Recovery - finding stolen property. It should be noted that a recovered article does not clear a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.

Reported Crimes - crimes reported to law enforcement officials.

NOTE: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed unfounded are excluded from the crime totals. (It should be mentioned that a change in reporting on the part of victims can effect an increase or a decrease for certain crimes.)

Residence - any dwelling structure used for human habitation.

Robbery - stealing or taking anything from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories:

* Highway - robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys, outside of structures.

* Commercial house - hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies.

* Gas or service stations - sell gasoline and related products.

* Convenience stores - neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items.

* Residence - robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises.

* Banking establishments - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc.

* Miscellaneous - churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.

Serious Injury - personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.

Uniform Crime

Reports - standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.

Uniform Crime

Reporting System - is the depository of the Uniform Crime Reports and Incident Reporting forms and provides for the collection and dissemination of crime data.

Unlawful entry - involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.

Urbanized areas - incorporated or unincorporated places of 2500 or more inhabitants.

Violent Crimes - index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.

TOTAL INDEX CRIME

Total Index Crime is comprised of the Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.* Both offense and arrest data are collected for Part I crime.

ALABAMA CRIME - 1996 SUMMARY OFFENSE DATA

- There were 203,463 crimes reported in 1996, less than a 1% decrease from 1995.
- The crime rate for the state was 4761.6 per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On a daily average, there were 557 Part I offenses reported.
- The total property value stolen in 1996 was \$185,871,146; 19% was recovered.
- There were 370 Law Enforcement Officers assaulted in 1996. On the average, one officer was assaulted per day in 1996. 44% received serious injuries and 56% received minimal or no injuries.

Clearance and Arrest Data

- There were 42,767 clearances in 1996, providing a clearance rate of 21%.
- A total of 36,900 persons were arrested for Part I offenses.* Part I arrests made up 17% of all arrests in Alabama in 1996.
- Juveniles made up 21% of the Part I arrests, males made up 73% of persons arrested for Part I offenses, 60% of those arrested for Part I offenses were black and 40% were white.
- A total of 180,096 people were arrested for Part II offenses; 6% of Part II arrests were juveniles. Males made up 80% of Part II arrests. Whites made up 52% and blacks, 48% of Part II arrests.
- A total of 15,580 people were arrested for narcotic drug violations. 7% were for sale and 93% for possession. 90% were adult and 10% juvenile.
- There were 39,564 people arrested for alcohol violations: 48% were arrested for driving under the influence; 20% were arrested for liquor law violations; and 32% for public drunkenness. 97% of the alcohol arrests were adults and 3% were juveniles.

VIOLENT CRIME

Violent Crime is comprised of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are designated as Violent Crimes because they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

Violent Crime Summary 1996

- There were 24,583 Violent Crimes reported in 1996, a 7% decrease from 1995. Violent crime makes up 12% of the total Index offenses.
- The violent crime rate was 575.3 per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On the average, there were 67.4 violent crimes reported per day.
- There were 10,939 violent crimes cleared in 1996 for a 44% clearance rate.
- In 1996, 10,992 people were arrested for Violent Crimes: 91% were adults; 32% were white; and, 82% were male.

HOMICIDE

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, justifiable homicides which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

* * * * *

- There were 432 homicides in Alabama in 1996 representing a 7% decrease from 1995.
- The homicide rate was 10.1 per 100,000 inhabitants, with an average of 1.2 homicides per day. 291 homicides were cleared for a 67% clearance rate.
- There were 402 persons arrested for homicide: 12% were juveniles; 84% were males; and 25% were white.
- The age group with the greatest number of homicide victims was 18-26, comprising 29% of the homicide victims. 44% had black victims and black offenders; 16% had white victims and white offenders, 3% black victim and white offender, 4% white victim and black offender, and in 33%, the offender was unknown.
- Handguns were used in 63% of all homicides, knives in 15%, hands, fists or feet in 4%, and other firearms, such as rifles and shotguns, in 10%.
- 13% of homicide victims were related to the offender, and 41% were acquainted with the offender. 23% of the victims were killed by strangers and in 23% the offender was unknown. In 5% of all homicides the victim and offender were boyfriend/girlfriend, and 13% of all homicides were domestic in 1996.
- 34% of the homicides were a result of an argument, 21% of the homicides occurred during the commission of a felony, and in 42% of the homicides the circumstances were unknown.
- 20% of all homicides occurred on a Wednesday. 47% occurred at a residence while 20% occurred on a highway, street or in an alley.
- 8 children died as a result of child abuse: 6 males and 2 females. They ranged in age from infant to 6 years old. One child was killed by a parent, two children were killed by step-parents, three children were killed by a friend of a parent, and two children were killed by other family members.

- 11 homicides occurred during drug deals. The victims' ages ranged from 14 to 49. The offenders' ages ranged from 16 to 28. All of the victims were males. In all of the cases the weapon used was a handgun. Six of the victims and offenders were acquainted.
- There were 31 juvenile homicide victims in 1996. Nine of these juveniles were killed by other juveniles. 81% of the victims were male, and 81% were black. 68% were killed by people they knew; 23% during an argument; 58% with a handgun.

RAPE

Rape is the carnal knowledge of a female through force or the threat of force, includes attempts.*

* * * * *

- 1,329 rapes were reported in Alabama in 1996. This is a 2% increase over 1995.
- The rape rate was 61.0 per 100,000 females.
- 684 rapes were cleared for a 51% clearance rate.
- On the average, there were 3.6 rapes reported per day in 1996.
- 456 males were arrested for rape with 11% being juveniles. Black males made up 57% of rape arrests. 27.3 is the average age of the rape offender with a range from 11 to 77 years.
- 23.5 is the average age of the rape victim with a range from 1 to 88 years. 48% of the rape victims in Alabama were white females; 49% were black females, and 3% were other or unknown.
- In 65% of the rapes, the victim and offender knew or were related to each other; in 19% the victim and offender were strangers; and in 16% the relationship was unknown.
- 29% of the rapes involved a white victim and white offender; 14% a white victim and black offender; 45%, a black victim and black offender; 1%, a black victim and white offender. In 11% the race of the offender was unknown.
- In 72% of the rapes, hand, fists and/or verbal threats were used to exert force upon a victim; guns were used in 10%, and knives in 6% of the rapes.
- 32% of the rapes occurred in the victim's residence; 14% in the offender's residence; 6% in a street or alley, and 6% in the offender's vehicle. The majority of all rapes occurred on a Saturday or on a Friday.
- 78% of victims reported no other injuries from the rape and 53% submitted to a medical exam.

*Male victims of sexual assault are included in the aggravated assault category. There were 9 male sexual assault victims in 1996.

Robbery is the stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, includes attempts.

* * * * *

- There were 6,868 robberies reported in 1996, an 11% decrease from 1995.
- The robbery rate was 160.7 per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were 18.8 robberies reported per day in 1996.
- There were 2,353 robberies cleared for a 34% clearance rate.
- 2,042 persons were arrested for robbery: 20% were juveniles; 19% were white; and, 89% were males.
- In 54% of the robberies a firearm was used; 26% were strong arm; in 6% a knife or cutting instrument was used; and in 14% other dangerous weapons were used. In 72% of the robberies the victim was not injured.
- 16% occurred on a Friday, and 17% on a Saturday. 25% occurred on a highway, street or in an alley; 18% at a residence; 11% in a parking lot; 12% at a convenience store; 13% at another commercial establishment; 3% at a service station; 1% at a bank; and 17% on all other premises.

Assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, includes attempts.

* * * * *

- There were 15,954 aggravated assaults reported in 1996 for a 6% decrease from 1995.
- There were 373.4 assaults per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were 43.7 assaults reported per day. 7,611 assaults were cleared for a 48% clearance rate.
- 8,092 people were arrested for aggravated assault in 1996: 6% were juvenile, 79% were male and 35% were white.
- 31% of the assaults were a result of firearms; 29% other dangerous weapons; 17% knives; and, 23% hands and fists. 59% of the victims were injured.
- There were 9 male sexual assault victims included in the aggravated assault category.
- In 34% of the assaults the victim was a friend or acquaintance of the offender; in 27% the victim and offender were family; 13% were strangers; and 13% were boyfriend/girlfriend.

Property Crime Summary 1996

- In 1996 there were 178,880 property crimes reported. This is a 1% increase from 1995. Property crime makes up 88% of the total Index offenses.
- The property crime rate was 4186.3 per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average there were 490 property crimes reported per day.
- A total of 31,828 property crimes were cleared in 1996 for an 18% clearance rate.
- In 1996, 25,908 people were arrested for property crimes: 74% were adults; 44% were white; and 70% were males.
- Total property value stolen in 1996 was \$185,871,146; 19% was recovered.

Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry and attempted forcible entry.

* * * * *

- There were 42,038 burglaries reported in 1996, a 2% decrease from 1995.
- There were 938.8 burglaries per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were 115 burglaries reported per day.
- 4,980 burglaries were cleared for a 12% clearance rate.
- 3,846 persons were arrested for burglary: 27% juveniles; 92% males; and 47% white.
- 74% of the burglaries were forcible entry, 24% were unlawful entries, and 2% were attempted forcible entry. In 52% of burglaries the point of entry was a door; in 24% a window; and in 24% the point of entry was other.
- There were 25,109 residential burglaries with 34% being at night, and 66% during the day. There were 16,929 non-residential burglaries with 47% being at night, and 53% during the day. 17% of all burglaries occurred on a Friday while 15% occurred on a Tuesday.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor Vehicle Theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, includes attempts.

* * * * *

- There were 15,369 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1996 for a 5% increase over 1995.
- The motor vehicle theft rate* for Alabama in 1996 was 372 thefts for every 100,000 registered vehicles. On the average, there were 42.1 motor vehicles stolen per day.
- A total of 2,905 motor vehicle thefts were cleared for a clearance rate of 19%.
- A total of 1,588 people were arrested in 1996 for motor vehicle theft: 25% were juveniles; 85% were males; and, 40% were white. 50% of the juveniles arrested were below the legal driving age of 16.
- The dollar value resulting from locally stolen motor vehicles was \$82,222,630. The value recovered was \$28,516,115 or 35%.

ARSON

Arson is the willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. It should be noted that the hierarchy rule does not apply to arson, meaning that any offense(s) committed in conjunction with arson results in the most serious offense, as well as the arson incident, being reported to UCR.

* * * * *

- A total of 695 arsons were reported in 1996. This represents a 15% decrease from 1995. 66% were structural arsons, 32% were motor vehicles and other mobile property, and 2% were other.
- There were 138 arsons cleared in 1996 for a 20% clearance rate.
- On the average, there were 1.9 arsons reported per day.
- There were 149 people arrested for arson: 23% were juveniles; 82% were males; and, 55% were white.
- In 23% of the structural arsons, the building was uninhabited or not normally in use.
- The total value of property damaged or destroyed by arson amounted to \$11,300,015. Structural arsons amounted to \$10,095,574 for an average of \$22,091 per incident. Arson of mobile property amounted to \$1,048,916 in damages for an average of \$4,746 per incident. Arson of other property caused \$155,525 in damages for an average of \$9148 per incident.

- A total of 180,096 persons were arrested in Alabama in 1996 for Part II offenses.
- This is up 4% from 1995's figure of 173,077.
- 52% of Part II arrestees were white and 48% were black.
- 94% of the Part II arrests were adults.
- Males made up 80% of Part II arrests.
- Liquor violations (DUI, drunkenness, liquor laws violations) made up 22% of the Part II arrests. Narcotics violations made up 9% of the Part II arrests.

Part II Offenses include:

Other assaults - non-aggravated assaults.

Forgery and counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.

Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.

Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

Stolen property - buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.

Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

Part II Offenses (Continued):

Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

Prostitution and commercialized vice - sex offenses of a commercial nature.

Sex offenses (other than rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice) - statutory

rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.

Narcotic drug laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.

Gambling - promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

Offenses against the family and children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.

Driving under the influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

Liquor laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.

Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.

Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.

Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.

All other offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations. Including, but not limited to bigamy, blackmail, bribery, contempt of court, discrimination, perjury, possession or sale of obscene material, quarantine violations, etc.

Liquor Violations

- There were 39,564 people arrested for alcohol violations in 1996.
- 19,010 people were arrested for DUI with 99% being 18 and over. 86% of the DUI arrests were males, 75% of DUI arrests were white.
- There were 8,050 people arrested for liquor laws violations (bootlegging, buying or selling to minors, etc.) 11% were juveniles, 86% were males and 83% were white.
- There were 12,504 people arrested in 1996 for public drunkenness. 1% were juveniles, 87% were males and 69% were white.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

Drug abuse violations involve the illegal sale, possession, manufacture, use, cultivation, etc. of narcotic and non-narcotic drugs.

Illegal drugs are divided into four categories:

1. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives such as morphine, heroin, codeine, and "crack".
2. Marijuana.
3. Synthetic narcotics which are manufactured narcotics which cause true drug addiction such as demerol and methadone.
4. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs which include barbiturates, Bensedrine, etc.

* * * * *

- There were 15,580 persons arrested for drug violations, 7% were for sale of drugs and 93% were for possession.
- 10% of the drug arrests were juveniles, 85% were males and 41% were white.
- Marijuana possession resulted in the greatest number of arrests for drug violations, 8,981 for 58% of the drug arrests. Possession of cocaine resulted in 4,774 arrests, or 31% of all drug arrests.

OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Killed

In 1996, one law enforcement officer was killed by felonious act in the line of duty in Alabama. Two law enforcement officers were killed in traffic accidents in 1996.

February 26, 1996 An Alabama State Trooper was killed in a traffic accident while on duty.

Sept. 30, 1996 An officer with the Monroeville Police Department was killed in a traffic accident while en route to the Montgomery Police Academy.

December 13, 1996 A Mobile Police Department motorcycle patrol officer was killed in a hit-and-run vehicular homicide while on duty.

Assaulted

In 1996 there were 370 law enforcement officers assaulted in the line of duty. One hundred sixty-two, or 44%, received serious injuries. The remainder received minimal or no injuries.

Hands, fists or feet were used in 281 assaults or 76% of the incidents. Firearms were used in 33 cases or 9%.

Responding to a disturbance call was the most dangerous police activity, resulting in 28% of the assaults. The next most dangerous activity was attempting to arrest a suspect, resulting in 19% of the assaults.

Eighty-five percent of the assaults on police officers were cleared.

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

$$\frac{\text{CLEARANCES}}{\text{REPORTED OFFENSES}} = \text{CLEARANCE RATE}$$

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.

COUNTY DATA

Alabama is comprised of sixty-seven (67) counties, each averaging 756.8 square miles.

Incorporated and unincorporated areas not having a municipal police department are protected by the county sheriff and are included in his jurisdiction. Since UCR data deals with criminal activity in a particular geographic area rather than with law enforcement agencies' activities, we do not intend, nor recommend, that this data be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another.

So, due to the diverse demographic characteristics, the county data will be presented in alphabetical order rather than by population strata. It will include reported crime and clearance data submitted by Alabama's 67 county sheriffs. County data does not include crime data submitted by municipal police departments contained within the county boundaries. The numbers in parentheses on the following pages denote the number of months the agency reported to UCR if it was less than twelve.

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.
